Kanaka Creek Road Improvements project is a Federally funded project (STP) which was constructed during this period. Total STP funding \$784,556

6. If ROW has been acquired for a transportation project, describe.

During the design phase a survey was conducted that determined additional right of way was required to construct the proposed improvements. Kanaka Creek Road Improvements Project acquired 4 parcels that had no residential and/or non-residential relocation requirements. No residential individuals or families were displaced by this project. As per 23 CFR 635.309 (c), right of way has been acquired in accordance with current FHWA regulations (49 CFR Part 24) and policies covering the acquisition of real property.

No minority, low income, elderly or disabled persons were affected.

One concern was raised about some of the appraisal comparables were from a nearby community rather than Stevenson, and additionally asked if the City was willing to increase it's offer of \$1,029. The City of Stevenson countered with \$1,129 and she accepted.
