The January 2020 estimate population is 1,620. None of the City's census data is of sufficient detail to indicate where minority populations are living.

**Russell Avenue Project** is a federally funded project (STP) which was in design and pre-construction phase during this period. Total STP funding is \$\$830,000.

**Sheppard Chipseal Project** is a state (TIB) funded project for \$25,013.64 which took place in 2019 and awarded to Skamania County. Total TIB funding was \$23,763.

**First Street Overlook Project** is a federally funded project (STP) which was awarded in 2019. Design funds total \$132,800.

During the design phase for the **Russell Avenue Project**, a survey was conducted that determined additional temporary construction easements were required to construct the proposed improvements. The City acquired temporary construction easements on 5 parcels for a total of \$2,400 that had no residential and/or non-residential relocation requirements. No residential individuals or families are displaced by this project. As per 23 CFR 635.309 (c), right of way has been acquired in accordance with current FHWA regulations (49 CFR Part 24) and policies covering the acquisition of real property.
