SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the USDA Rural Utility Service (RUS), as required by the National Environmental Policy Act, is issuing an environmental assessment (EA) in connection with possible impacts related to a project proposed by the City of Stevenson, Washington. The proposal is to make repairs to the wastewater treatment plant and to replace four pump stations and 700 feet of gravity sewer main.

The City of Stevenson, Washington has submitted an application to USDA RUS for funding of the proposal.
